Errata

Although extensive, the publication process allowed for a number of errors in this volume. The following corrections for errors or grammatical preferences have been identified thus far:

Page 81, paragraph 7, line 2. “Not teaching the importance of maintaining and enhancing our ecological integrity, I believe, is fundamentally wrong.”

Page 82, paragraph 5, line 2. “I stand by my belief that all things are related and interact accordingly and changing any one component or more of these components will have an effect on our lives, even small changes have the potential to create major impacts on life itself.”

Page 82, paragraph 6, line 1. “The ecological integrity of the watershed has been compromised for many years, in fact for several centuries and continues to be impacted by change.”

Page 82, paragraph 6, line 6. “Farming has impacted surrounding land use practices.”

Page 83, paragraph 2, line 1. “What has been lost by society has been, with much difficulty, retained by First Nations communities.”
